# What is the COR program?

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A **voluntary** employer certification initiative introduced by WorkSafeBC

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**2002:** The program was piloted in the construction sector


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**October 2008:** COR Program Standards and Guidelines was published

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**2019:** An update of the COR program occurred supported by research showing **significant reductions in firm injury rates after certification**

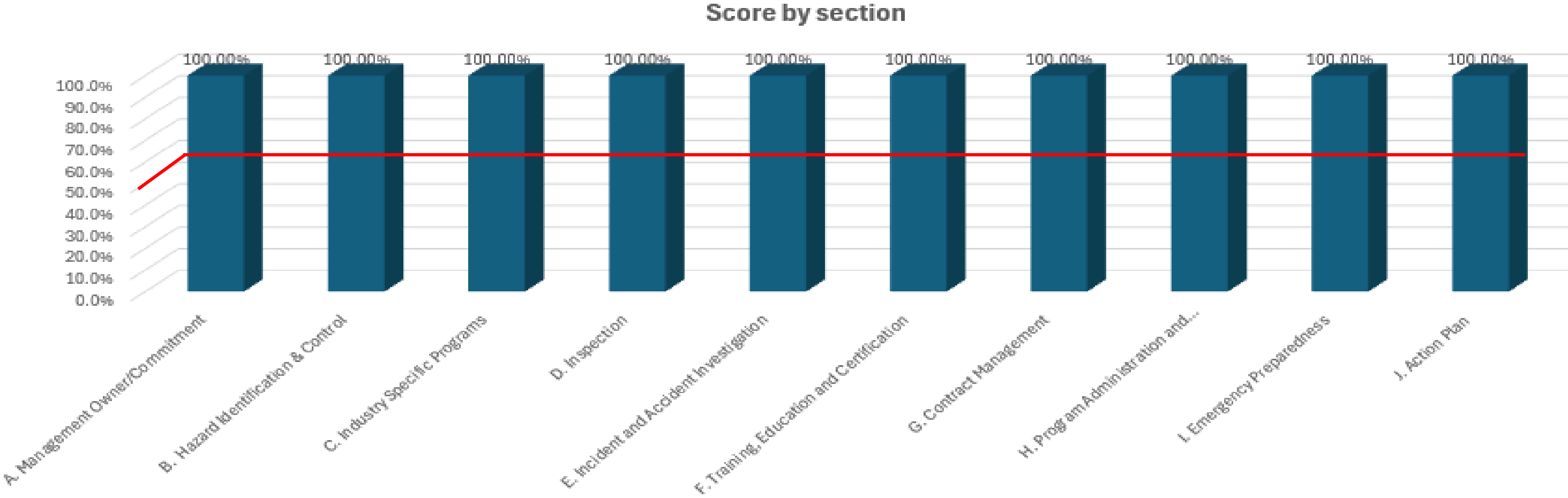

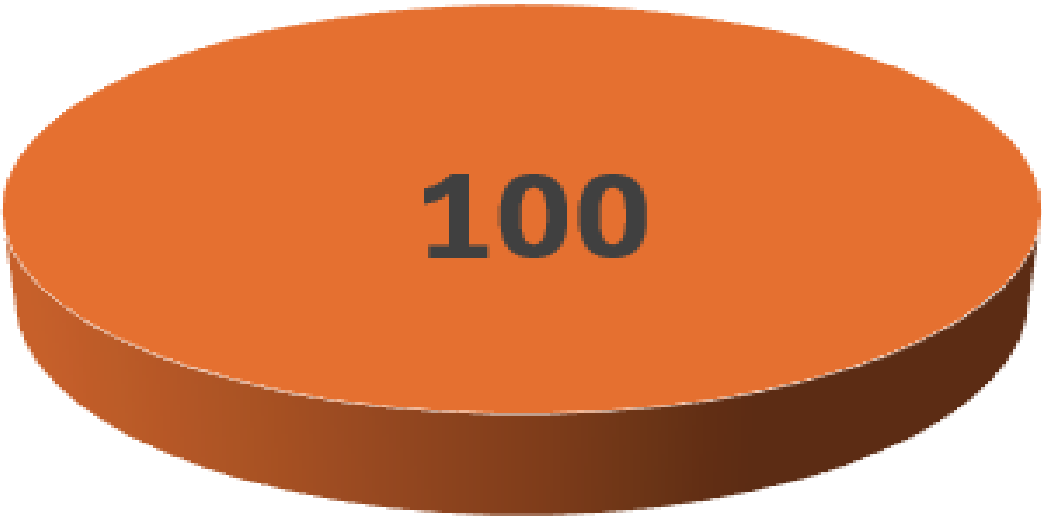

## 3) Safety advice by Alliance service team to fill the gaps if necessary

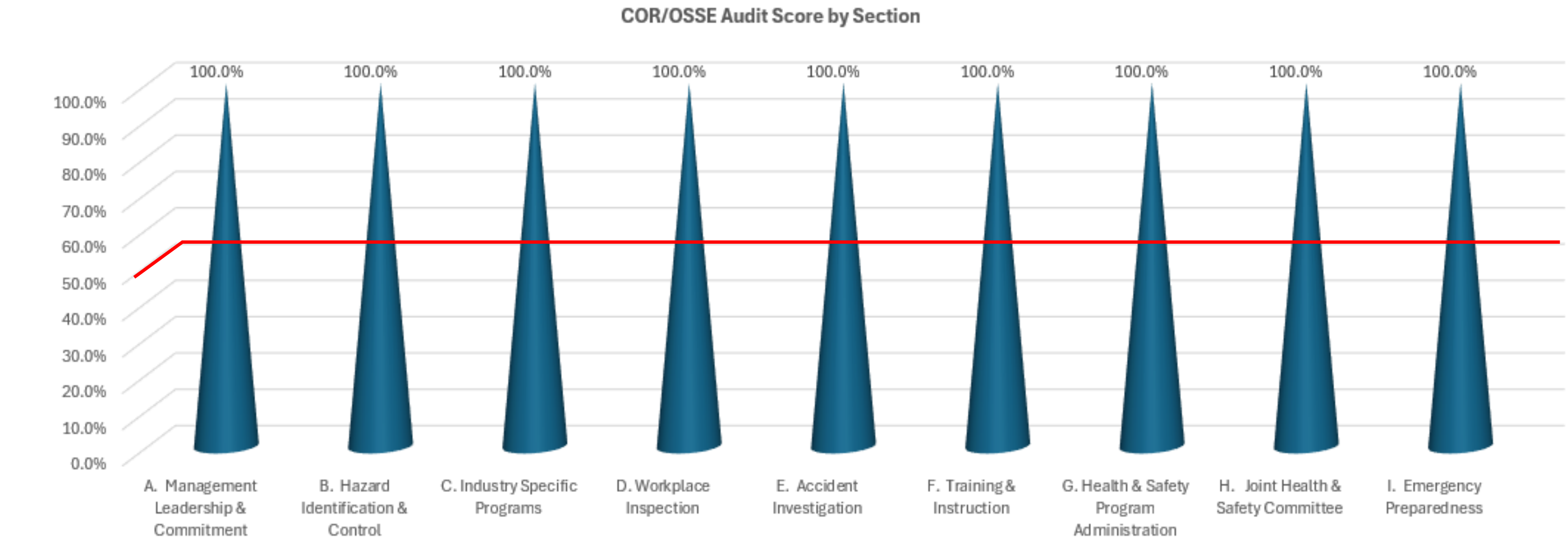
## 4) Audit

 <b>DOCUMENT REVIEW</b>					
A.1.5.1 Review new-hire documentation, reference documentation given to workers, and safety meeting records. Look for evidence that the policy has been reviewed with workers. If documentation is present, award 5 points. (0, 5)		Point awarded		5	
 <b>OBSERVATION</b>					
A.1.5.2 Review the site to determine if the policy is posted in areas accessible to workers (for example, lunchrooms, coffee rooms or bulletin boards. If yes, award 5 points. (0, 5)		Point awarded		5	
 <b>INTERVIEW</b>					
A.1.5.3 Interview a representative number of workers to determine if the policy has been communicated. Award a maximum of 10 points based on the percentage of positive responses (1-20% = 2 point, 21-40% = 4 points, 41-60% = 6 points, 61-80% = 8 points, 81-100% = 10 points. (0-10)
