A **voluntary** employer certification initiative introduced by WorkSafeBC

2002: The program was piloted in the construction sector

October 2008: COR Program Standards and Guidelines was published

2019: An update of the COR program occurred supported by research showing <u>significant reductions in firm injury rates after certification</u>






COR/OSSE Audit Score by Section
